Hardy County is a beautiful area with many different habitats offering a large variety of birds to view. Kathy King has lived in [Hardy County] since 1988 and has seen almost 200 different species of birds here. Some of her favorite birding areas include:

Fish Pond Road (west out of Old Fields)

Often seen in season:

- Red-headed Woodpeckers
- Blue Grosbeaks
- Horned Larks
- Eastern Kingbirds
- Grasshopper Sparrow

Have seen in years past:

- Loggerhead Shrike

Brighton Park and Vicinity (South of Moorefield)

Often seen in season:

- Bald Eagles
- Green Heron
- Great Blue Heron
- Common Mergansers
- Killdeer (nesting)
- Warbling Vireos

Have occasionally seen:

- Great Heron
- Osprey

The Trough (Along South Branch River by boat or train)

Often seen in season:

- Bald Eagles (nesting)
- Wood Ducks
- Orioles
- Kingfishers
- Swallows

Cunningham Lane (Spring – Wet pasture North of Road past RR tracks)

Often seen in season:

- Pectoral Sandpipers
- Yellowlegs
- Dunlin
- Common Snipe
- Sandpipers
- Plover
- Killdeer

Have seen:

- American Golden Plover

Lost River Valley and Kimsey Run Dam

Often seen in winter:

- Bald Eagles I numbers (up to 50 at one time)
- Golden Eagles
- Grebes (in migrations)
- Loons (in migrations)
- Ducks (in migrations)
- Red-headed Woodpeckers

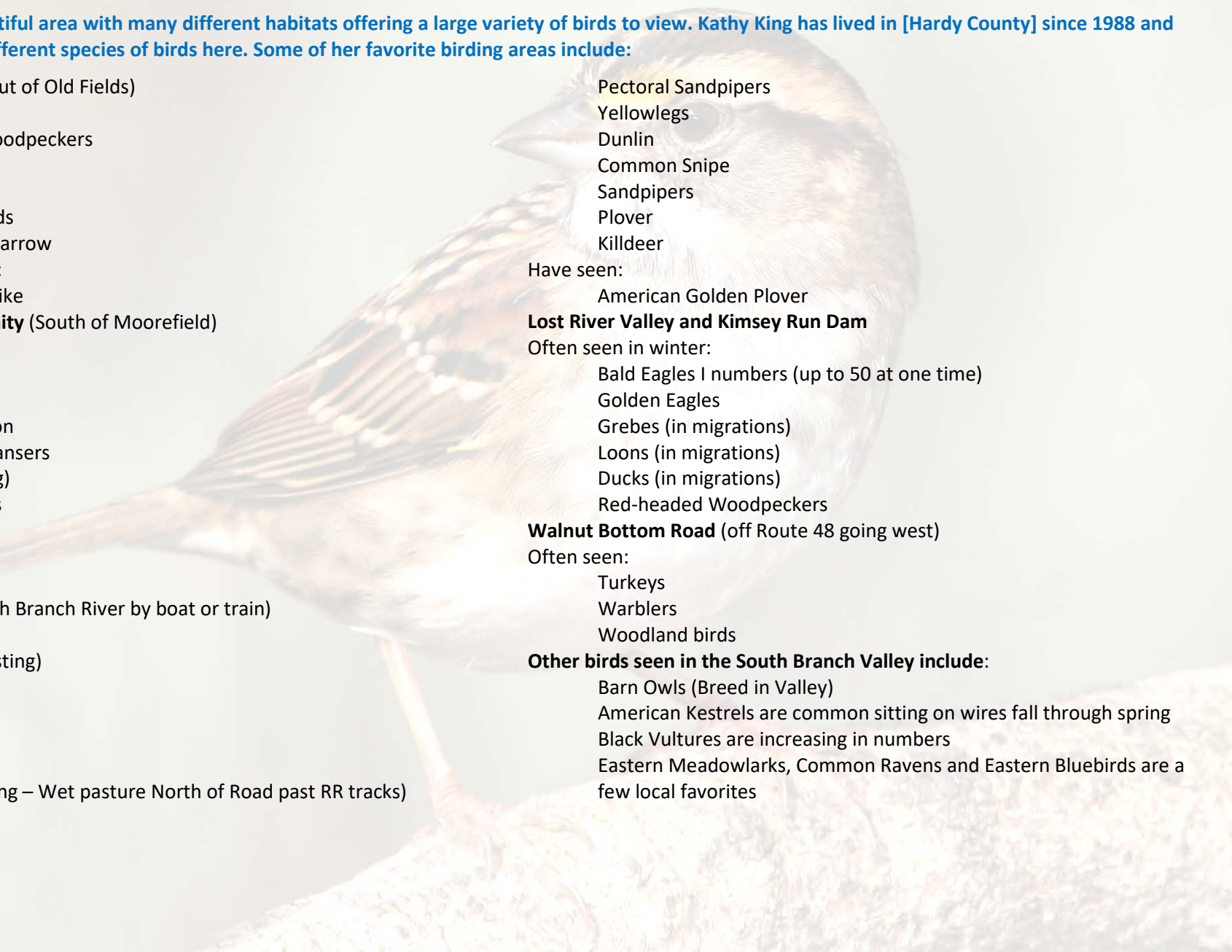
Walnut Bottom Road (off Route 48 going west)

Often seen:

- Turkeys
- Warblers
- Woodland birds

Other birds seen in the South Branch Valley include:

- Barn Owls (Breed in Valley)
- American Kestrels are common sitting on wires fall through spring
- Black Vultures are increasing in numbers
- Eastern Meadowlarks, Common Ravens and Eastern Bluebirds are a few local favorites



Shooks Run in Hardy County in West Virginia

The Shooks Run is a *top location for bird watching in the State of West Virginia*. The Shooks Run is profiled on the United States Geological Service (USGS) Petersburg East Topological map. The Shooks Run is located at the latitude and longitude coordinates of *38.9384439 and -79.0044744* at an elevation of 295 feet. *Shooks Run is situated in Hardy County in the State of West Virginia*. 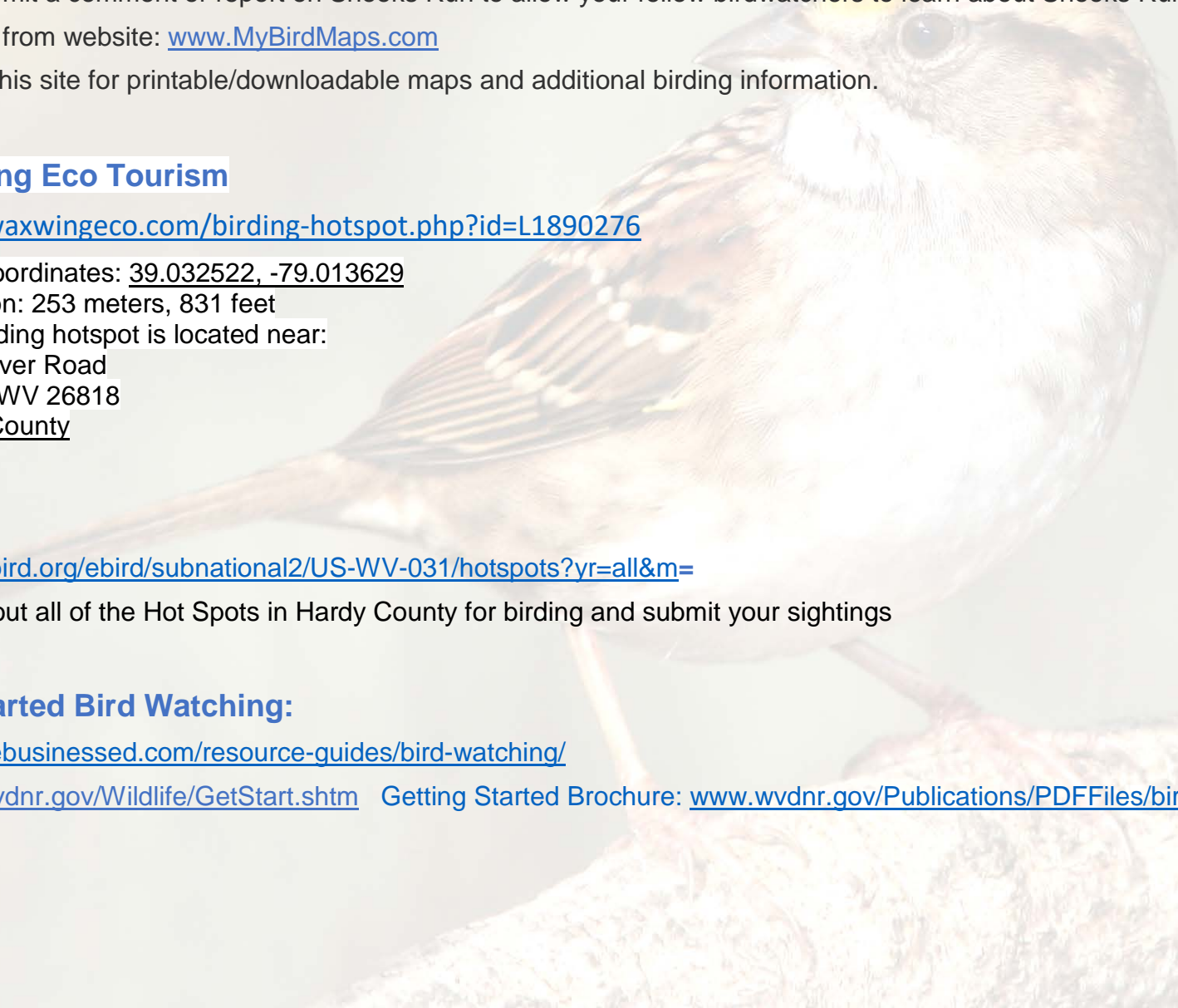
